

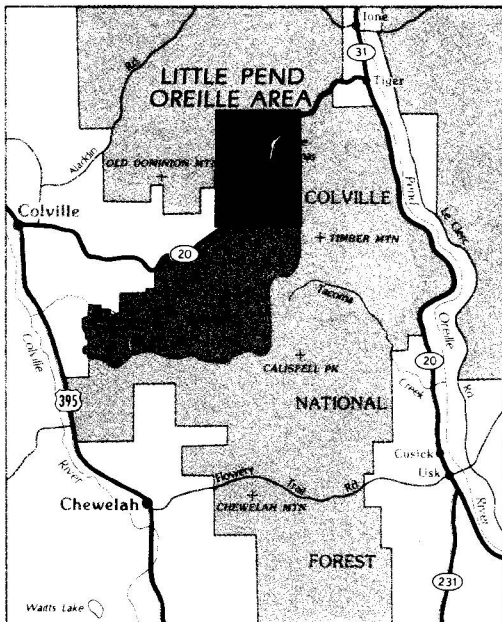

## Taylor Ridge - Twin Sisters

This area offers both four-wheel drive and trailbike opportunities. The four-wheel drive route past Twin Sisters is over old logging roads. The roads have deteriorated to the point of challenging four-wheel drives.

The trailbike route goes up Taylor Ridge. None of the trails are rated for difficulty. They do offer spectacular vistas of the Kettle Range and are lightly traveled.

## Little Pend Oreille

No trails existed prior to 1980, but now almost 40 miles are designed for trailbikes.

The project would not have been possible without cooperation between the Department of Natural Resources and the Colville National Forest. Both agencies have worked to build a loop system, mostly on department lands, with department ORV funds.

The Colville Ranger District has plans to extend the trail north from the new loop system. The Little Pend Oreille trail system connects with the Batey-Bould trail system.

The trails are rated easy and more difficult.
